In response to your inquiry, let me begin by saying that my wife and I are now involved in what can only be described as a contentious divorce. As in most contentious divorces, people make allegations at temporary hearings that are often unsupported by the evidence and that later turn out to be false. Please bear in mind that my wife and I are in litigation, and therefore my response must be one that is mindful of the legal and procedural restraints that are inherent in the judicial process. You have asked me to address the following allegations: 1) that I had in my possession counterfeit money; 2) that I had in my possession "sensitive" agency documents; and 3) information regarding my business dealings with a company known as Haab Enterprises.

After reading my wife's affidavit, I immediately notified the United States Secret Service ("USSS") of my wife's allegations. I met with members of the USSS to address any concerns and have complied fully with any and all requests by the USSS.

As you may be aware, I was employed by the United States Secret Service ("USSS") for a period of Ten (10) years. At the time I left the Secret Service, I was a one man agent assigned to a district of ten counties in GA and spent most of my time in that assignment in my car traveling those assigned counties. Upon my resignation I turned in my accountable property to include equipment and files. Most agents have counterfeit money to use for educational purposes when they go out and speak to schools or civic groups. I was no different and this was the money that was contained in my filing cabinet that also included many other items accumulated during my ten (10) year career. The money was (of mixed denominations and totaled about \$2,000.00). This counterfeit currency was all marked with USSS inventory markers and was cataloged at the time it was confiscated. All of this currency is now in the possession of the Secret Service and they found no wrong doing on my part.

Regarding the "sensitive" documents, I have never shared sensitive documents with and all of the files you have referenced have been returned to the USSS. At some point in 2012, I introduced my wife to and and the three of us discussed a business concept but that concept never got off the ground. I certainly did not share documents with as my wife has alleged.

As to your inquiry about Haab Enterprises, I am not allowed to discuss this issue based upon inherent confidentiality/nondisclosure agreements that prevent me from doing so. I would also add that all of my employees signed nondisclosure agreements when employed by my company. My wife was an employee of my company at the relevant times.
